Let unvaccinated healthcare workers fill the void: Dametto

With more than 2300 Queensland Health staff currently on leave due to COVID-19¹ and close to 1000 hospitalisations with COVID-19 or influenza, Katter's Australian Party (KAP) Deputy Leader and Hinchinbrook MP, Nick Dametto is pleading the Government to drop the vaccine mandate still in place for Queensland healthcare workers in order to alleviate the staffing pressure on the healthcare system.

The Hinchinbrook MP's calls come after 6900 new cases of COVID-19² were recorded in Queensland on Wednesday (14 July), with more than 45,000 active cases.

"The reality is COVID-19 is a virus we have no choice but to learn to live with, that's evident in the number of cases we're seeing, people are getting on with their lives, but our poor healthcare system is still being hamstrung by the Government's vaccine mandate," Mr Dametto said

"It just doesn't make sense that we have healthcare workers who are fit for work, being force to stand down because they are unvaccinated while the State is experiencing a severe worker shortage."

Mr Dametto questioned why the mandate was still in place for workers in healthcare and hospitals especially when a COVID-19 positive parent can gain clearance to enter a hospital to visit their sick child.

As of the 30th of June, COVID-19 vaccinations were no longer required for workers in 'high-risk settings' such as early childhood, primary and secondary education, prisons, youth detention centres and watch houses and airports.

"How is it fair to allow some workers in high-risk settings back to work while excluding our healthcare workers?" Mr Dametto said.

"How can the Government sit by idly while there are people ready to fill those gaps?

"Unvaccinated Queensland healthcare workers could safely return to work by implementing strict workplace health and safety protocols such as the use of Personal Protective Equipment.
